

their contents from pursuers. A diagram would fit only a few vehicles, but this explanation should be understood by anyone at all handy with cars and trucks. It's also relevant to motorbikes and scooters, though probably not for skateboards.

First, a hole is drilled in the exhaust manifold the size of the nozzle of a

paint spraying handpump. When the nozzle is welded in place, a length of rubber hose is attached to the nozzle tube, and fed to the driver's seat.

The rubber hose line is then attached to the spray pump inside the glovebox under the dash.

Solid brass spraypumps are usually available at garden shops. Their nozzles are removed and welded to the exhaust manifold and the container is put inside with the dirver and connected to the nozzle unit with a length of rubber hose.

To use, the container is filled with castor oil. Burned castor oil will blot out everythi8ng on the road behind you.

A friend tried this, and just put in a few short squirts to see what it would do. The effect from his exhaust pipe was so wild that it looked like a bomb had been dropped on the motorway.

He was so startled that he allowed himself to be pulled over by a traffic cop and he almost got taken in for it. He could have got away if he had made a smokey run for it.

It is the hot exhaust manifold which turns the castor oil to smoke. Smoke screens in wars are made using this principle. Old sump oil to be thrown away is also great for smoke screens. It could also highlight the idea of recycling in your suburb.

On the road, the smoke not only causes pursuers to slow down in order to see, but ti causes panic among the other drivers on the road. This makes the cops stop the chase, as the traffic hazards are greater than your capture is worth.

Sunday CRACCUM Exclusive 'TOURNEY RIGGED' DRUG SCANDAL

AIRLINE

INVOLVED

PROBE REVEALS VOTE STUFFING

In a sensational scoop, SUN-DAY CRACCUM learnt of someone copying ballot papers in a recent AUSA referendum.

Do you remember the proposed \$100 000 advertising campaign against Cost Recovery? It was held during the second term, and the results were as follows:

'THAT AUSA may spend up to \$100 000 on an anti-user Pays Campaign in 1987' For 859, against 338, Ivan Kirk 1. This motion was clearly carried, but voting was much closer on the second motion 'THAT AUSA proceed with the newspaper advertising campaign as presented by Hutchinson, Knowles, and Marinkovich for 14 newspaper advertisements costs at approximately \$100 000'. For 574, Against 605. Therefore this motion was lost by just 31 votes. Rumours have been abounding about the future of all time classic band, the Beatles. In this exclusive investigation, SUNDAY CRACCUM details their plans, and reveals the links the band has to Colonel Gaddaffi, Margaret Thatcher, and the US Presidential contest.



It was dim and it was dark, the smells of stale beer and cigarette smoke drifted over me seeking the outside air. As my eyes slowly adjusted from the outside glare I saw my informant. It still seemed strange to me that he had insisted on this meeting on neutral ground, what fear had caused this, or was it merely his habit to conduct business in public bars at 11 in the morning.

Slowly he told me his tale above the sounds of the patrons and space invaders. He had purchased, quite legitimately it seems, his 1980 Yamaha Passola in 1983 for \$400. 

Banqueting on a Bursary

KIWIFRUIT & WALNUT CASSEROLE

As the saying goes, there is nothing like a good kiwifruit and walnut casserole:


